Be careful what you wish for

Doing anything to fly means – Job first, everything else second

**Pink States – Battle Ground States** 


There are not easy hours! – Maybe Seasonal

# Fastest Way to Build Time - In Order

Buy a Champ and Fly it Yourself – 150 hours/month 4 gph x 1200= 4800 Annual – nothing wrong – 2000 Oil changes and 100 hours – 5000 Total=\$11,800



Fastest Way to Build Time – In Order

Flight Instruction – 100+ hours per month



Fastest Way to Build Time – In Order

Banner towing – 50 – 75 hours per month



Fastest Way to Build Time – In Order

Air tours – 50 hours/month



Fastest Way to Build Time - In Order

Flying a turboprop for a company – 20-50 hours/month



The most difficult time to get – Battleground Hours!

Cross Country time – 10 hours per private pilot student



The most difficult time to get – Battleground Hours!

You need 500 – PIC 100 hours and or SIC



The most difficult time to get – Battleground Hours!

You need 100 hours – Night – 25 hours PIC After 20 TO/Landings you can substitute up to 25 hours for each TO and landing.



The most difficult time to get – Battleground Hours!

You need 75 hours – Simulated or Actual Instrument 25 can be Sim or AATD
